

Report from the Ride Captain

Touring Captain's Cogitations

Carol Davis has winning ways - she persuaded me being Touring Captain for the TWBC was not a hard job and didn't take much time. While she is probably right on both counts, it hasn't proved true for me! Past Touring Captains agree that updating the Rideline is an onerous part of the job. Perhaps there is a better way.

Imagine hitting the sack on Sunday night, only to suddenly rise up, remembering that the Rideline needs to be updated! You get out of bed with the heavy thought that you volunteered to do this every Sunday and Thursday night! You gather together the information on the rides, make the recording, but forget to press the # button on the phone at the right moment so the recording is not saved. Blearily, and with a croaking voice, you make the recording again---but this time - you mis-state the start time for one of the rides, so need to make the 3 minute recording again. The next time you speak too slowly so get cut off in mid sentence! Another redo! Finally, the Rideline is properly recorded and saved, and you return to bed.

I recently learned that the Rideline averages less than 180 calls a month (about 6 a day) during the summer and fewer than 50 per month during the winter and that most of these calls are from Members. I wonder if my efforts are worth it. Who calls the Rideline? Would they continue calling it if they knew the anxious and sleep deprived nights Rideline updates cause me? Would they continue to call if they knew hosting the Rideline costs the Club 50 cents per call? Can I persuade them that they will get better and more complete information about rides, start locations, etc., at the online Ride Calendar at www.twbc.org?

This is what I am cogitating about - changing the Rideline into a general message line about TWBC and telling callers to learn more about our Club and rides at twbc.org. If they want to leave a message for anyone in the Club, they still could do that. Our committee met again on Tuesday, July 7 at the Taqueria Guadalajara in the Stadium District at First and Tacoma Avenue. We plan to meet there again on Tuesday, August 4 at 6 PM to continue our progress. Our meeting was very well attended with 11 people to hear Ian Macek and T. J. Nedrow from the Washington Department of Transportation discuss several matters thanks to Ralph's efforts.

We first discussed several other things. The Puget Sound Regional Council's 2040 plan is out and available for comment as there are at least five alternative future transportation scenarios. The draft Pierce County Trail Plan is out on the website and the Countywide Transportation Plan is being developed thru the rest of the year. The first meeting for Tacoma's Mobility Plan has taken place and there will be 11 more monthly meetings to help guide plan development. Marguerite, Carla and I have been asked to provide input as committee members. Dianne Wiatr was present from the City to discuss the plan.

T. J. and Ian discussed the status of the **24th Street On-Ramp funds.** Our Club saved at least \$500,000 by avoiding construction of a tunnel on the Scott Pierson Trail near 24th Street near Gig Harbor, so \$512,000 was provided for other amenities near 24th Street. **Pierce County originally received** \$306,000 to help design and build bike shoulders in the area. The grant was reduced to \$123,000 down in Olympia and **needs to be spent by November. Gig Harbor received** \$175,000 to provide amenities for cyclists. **Tacoma received** \$15,000 to fund a small connection from Skyline to Jackson on the north side of SR 16.

Ian talked about the **Statewide Pedestrian and Bike Plan** and indicated that **staff training** is taking place relating to bike/ped design expectations and standards. This training will be widely distributed to Regional Transportation Planning Organizations. Ian said a few things about **Complete Streets** on the State Highway System. Near Tacoma, SR 99, Pearl Street and SR 167 will receive complete streets treatment. There is a process for including pedestrians and bikes on the highway system. We asked about **improving**

the State's Bike Map. Ian said there is no money available to even print more maps. We indicated the State of Missouri has a six-map sheet system where even local roads are shown as routes. North Carolina has a similar multimap system. T. J. talked about efforts to improve construction zone signing for peds and bikes.

There wasn't time enough to discuss the following items: 1) designation of SR 2 and SR 101 as Federally recognized bike interstate routes; 2) the proposed new crossing of the Columbia River between Portland and Vancouver; 3) education and enforcement efforts for our WSDOT District 10 and other districts.

There were several other local items of interest. We are continuing to follow the Sounder Train "D" to "M" Street extension across Pacific Avenue. I will attend a special meeting to further discuss the berm versus elevated structure alternatives. The Puvallup Riverwalk connection to the Foothills Trail is still not made and the matter needs our attention. Dixie Gatchell and I attended Advocacy Training in Puyallup. It was presented by the Tacoma Pierce County Health Department to promote healthy living. Dixie, a few others and I will be attending a two-day workshop put on by Puyallup and the Health Department to study improving the non-motorized environment in South Hill Puyallup. Dianne announced that seven bike racks would be coming to the **Tacoma Dome** thanks to Steve Brown's relentless efforts. The Mixed Use Centers Ordinance will be before the Tacoma City Council in early August. The City hopes to accommodate its required population growth in these centers and a complete streets proposal is contained within the Ordinance. This complete streets proposal will be incorporated into Tacoma's Mobility Plan.

It is time to ride. Last week, I went out and looked at the progress on the **extension of the Cushman Trail in Gig Harbor.** The trail should be finished late this year. We can still ride in August, September and October in dry conditions. I hope to se you on the road. Remember, ride more and worry less.

What's in a Name?

I have been a Member of the Tacoma Wheelmen's Bicycle Club for over 20 years. During that time, I have noticed that bicycling has become more and more popular. The Cascade Bicycle Club has doubled their membership from 5,000 members to over 10,000. But TWBC Membership has remained stagnant at around 300 members.

I don't think we will ever be as big as Cascade, but their growth shows that people are bicycling and getting involved with clubs. Our all-volunteer organization has a lot going for it. We offer a lot of rides; we are a friendly group, so why has our growth been limited?

I believe that one reason for our limited Membership may be our Club name. If you do a Google search on "Wheelmen", the first hit you get is a group that rides High Wheelers, those cycles with the huge front wheels. When I first got involved in this Club, people asked me if that's what our Club did. We did add "Bicycle" to our name at that point, but "Wheelmen" is an antiquated term that most people don't understand.

I have a lot of respect for the rich history of the term "Wheelmen" and our Club in Tacoma. The League of American Wheelmen was the national group that helped promote cycling and improve roads. Locally, we can trace our roots back to 1888, and many of us (including me) have photos from the early Club in our homes.

When I meet with representatives and government officials, I always have to spend some time explaining our name. "No, we aren't just men." "No, we don't ride high wheelers." Usually I only have a short time to present my case on improving laws or spending money to improve facilities for bicyclists. A name that more accurately reflected the nature of our Club would save time and effort.

Another reason to change our name is that Tacoma

Welcome to the Pierce County Pedalers!

A proposal to change the name of the Tacoma Wheelmen's Bicycle Club is being voiced once again by a few of our Members who have speculated that the number of Members is somehow dependent upon the TWBC name. Just as the wheels turn on our bikes, the name issue comes around about every eight years or so. It is the third time that a name change has been proposed since I joined TWBC. The last time was in 2000.

At that time, quite a bit of the Club's energy went into debating a potential name change. Well-written pro and con articles were published in the Newsletter. Those supporting a name change primarily based their view on TWBC being antiquated, politically incorrect, and sexist. Those in favor of retaining the name cited the historical significance of the Tacoma Wheelmen's Club ("Bicycle" was added later for clarity), the widespread recognition of TWBC and importance in name branding, and scoffed at the idea that "Wheelmen" reflects a sexist organization. There were several interesting responses on the latter. One person noted that her female friends would never think of changing the Ironman event to Ironperson. A self-described feminist relayed that "only a genuine stretch of paranoia could a case be made that the name of this club need be embroiled in sexual politics." A survey was conducted over a several month period with a response by 44 members. Two-thirds of the respondents voted that the name should not change.

So why would the name change proposal surface again? The TWBC name is not a barrier for those who enjoy cycling. Again citing a past response, "the club . . . is an organization dedicated to bicycling for both fun and pain for all." Well, hopefully we are more fun than pain. Another citation noted, "Keep in mind, branding is a very critical element, especially in lobbying, and a name change means starting all over again in gaining name familiarity – it is not something to do at all unless there is a major reason to do so." Who would know what the Pierce County Pedalers,

Wheelmen's Bicycle Club limits us to a location. I believe we are the Club for Pierce County as well as South King and North Thurston County. I lived in Auburn when I first got involved in bicycling and decided that it would be easier to join a Tacoma group. I think others feel the same way, and would be more likely to join a group with a less specific geographical name.

I believe it is our responsibility as a bicycling club to respond to and represent the needs of our Club Members. If we change our name to something that does not reflect a specific type of cycle, a specific gender, and a specific location, I believe we could attract more people from a greater geographical area.

I have been an active Member in the group and would love to see more people supporting bicycling in Pierce County. A larger group can help improve bicycling for everyone. Let's change our name to move ahead. Let's choose a name that will reach out to everyone in South Puget Sound.

ARTICLE IX AMEMDMENTS TO THE BY-LAWS

A. Submission:

- 1. A written copy of a proposed amendment to the By-Laws shall be submitted to a presiding Board Member at any Club Meeting.
- 2. The proposed amendment shall be read for the first time at that meeting.
- 3. Notice of the proposed amendment shall be given to the Members in the next regular Club Newsletter.
- B. Second Reading: At the next regular or Special Club Meeting, the proposed amendment shall be read for a second time and shall be open for discussion.
- C. Voting: A vote upon the proposed amendment shall be held after the second reading. The amendment shall be adopted upon the affirmative vote of a simple majority of those members present and voting.

aka PCP, (my tongue-in-cheek suggestion in 2000) was about? Among the many other suggestions were the Tacoma Bicycle Club, the Mt. Tahoma Bicycle Club, the Cascade Bicycle Club South, and a weird one that resulted in an acronym of SLURPS. When Bob Myrick or his legions of advocates talk with local elected or agency officials, they recognize TWBC's past and current advocacy efforts.

Would a simple name change increase TWBC's Membership? The Membership level of TWBC has been somewhat static for a number of years. Athletic organizations like TWBC typically have a Membership core of long-time Members but also a number of Members that join for short periods. Not to discount the valued volunteer efforts of our Members but in my opinion, TWBC as an organization has lacked a sustained marketing effort over the years. For example, while dropping off flyers at the various bike shops this year, I found that a number of them did not have our Membership brochures and many of the shops did not prominently display flyers or brochures about the Club and our Rides. Cascade Bicycle Club has successfully increased their membership substantially over the past several years by adopting a strategic plan that included the decision to focus on growth. They hired a development director as a result. TWBC could similarly improve its efforts through strategic coordination in recruiting and retaining Members and in targeting the right audience. The use of technology, prominent notices about TWBC, promoting our Club at the right forums, and presenting positive reasons for becoming and remaining a Member are key elements in marketing TWBC. A name change will not affect that.

A name change also has a financial and administrative cost. It would involve changes to our organization with the state, replacement of all promotional items and pre-printed material with our name and letterhead, TWBC jerseys would become obsolete (or collector items), and there would be confusion to many regarding our bike Club. The loss of the historic Tacoma Wheelmen's Bicycle Club name would be a shame. I would rather see our Membership and Board focus on measures that will promote and improve bicycling in our community and not needlessly expend energy in a misguided direction. ©

Find the online Ride Calendar by going to the lower right corner of the home page-- www.twbc.org –and under "Find a Ride" click on the link for "Online Ride Calendar."

By clicking on the name of the ride you want to do:

- 1) You get to see a photo of the Ride Leader along with their phone number and e-mail address in case you want to contact them for specifics about the upcoming ride.
- 2) You can click on "Show Start Location Map" and obtain a map showing you how to get to the start of the ride.
- 3) By clicking on "Who's Going" you can find out who else is doing this ride, and you can let others know you are coming by clicking on the green box above and to the right labeled "Intend to Participate."
- 4) If you choose to create a profile and upload a photo, when you note that you will be participating in the ride, your information, your photo and your comments about the upcoming ride are posted for the Ride Leader and others planning to do the ride to view.

Learn how to use and benefit from the online Ride Calendar. It will help you learn more about your fellow cyclists and enable you to easily see how to get to the start of the ride if unfamiliar to you.
